A need for true education

ACADEMIA in the United States no longer supports free thinking, open dialogue, and the pursuit of truth. Instead, it "has become more ideologically uniform, compromising the ability of scholars to seek truth, and of students to learn from a broad range of thinkers.\" Redeemer Classical School works to counteract this troubling trend and to provide the type of education described by Dr. King. Redeemer hopes to combat the current status quo:

INSUFFICIENT ACADEMICS

Conventional education is failing to produce citizens who are able to think critically, communicate effectively, listen to opposing view points, engage in genuine dialogue, who read great books, study history deeply, and who love that which is good, true, and beautiful.

SCARCITY OF BIBLICAL VIEWS

Our world is in desperate need of people who operate with a biblical worldview and who are able to winsomely share that worldview with others.

LACK OF CIVIL ENGAGEMENT

More than ever we need individuals who are equipped to be actively engaged in the public square for the good of their communities to the glory of God.

In short, we need individuals who are wise, virtuous and able to engage effectively. As the region's only classical Christian school, Redeemer Classical School seeks to cultivate just that.

A history of renewal

Redeemer Classical School first opened its doors in 2004, with 15 Logic School (6-8th grade) students in attendance. Redeemer quickly grew, adding a Kindergarten class the following year and expanding to a full PreK through 8th grade institution by 2014. And less than 20 years later, the first senior class will graduate from the Rhetoric School (9-12th grade) in 2024.

2015

Enrollment exceeds 100 students.

First **HVAC unit** installed in the school.



2017

Redeemer purchases the Keezletown School and begins substantial renovations on the campus starting with replacing both roofs.



2019

Renovations on the 2nd Floor of the original building are complete.

Asphalt replaces the gravel in the lower parking lot.

2021

Restoration of the two front rooms on the Ground **Floor** provide much-needed additional space.

2008

After four years of meeting in various churches, Redeemer moves into the newer gym classrooms at the former **Keezletown School**. (The original, historic front building remains unusable.)

2013

Renovations to one 1st Floor **classroom** in the original building are completed in order to accommodate the rise in enrollment to over **75**.







2014

Redeemer finishes the 1st Floor renovations to the original building — adding two more classrooms and the Front Office. Students enter school through the front doors for the first time.

2018

Renovations to the front half of the **2nd Floor** are finished.

HVAC units have been installed in all classroom and office spaces.

Mr. Ron Hoch joins Redeemer as the **new Head of School.**



2020

A revamp of the original Cannery transforms the building for the **Rhetoric School** and seven (7) pioneer students enroll in Redeemer's first 9th grade class.

Overall enrollment tops 150.

2022

Enrollment tops 200 students.

Future Plans -----

Expand the building in order to **add** at least four (4) more classrooms as we build out the Rhetoric School while also expanding Grammar School. We'll need enough space for two classes of each Grammar School grade level by FALL 2024.

Enriching the soil

We partner with parents to provide students with a QUALITY EDUCATION that prepares them for a LIFETIME OF LEARNING and LEADING well. Our curriculum utilizes time-tested methods to train students to think critically, communicate winsomely, engage in respectful dialogue, discern the truth, and promote meaningful change.



CLASSICAL CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The foundation of classical education is the "trivium," or the three stages of learning. We apply these techniques across subjects as they build on one another throughout a student's time at Redeemer. The stages also correspond to the ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE and HIGH SCHOOL grades, and they *capitalize on the developmental milestones* in a child's life.

The Trivium

GRAMMAR | The Knowledge Stage

PreK - 5th. Students focus on soaking up the facts.

LOGIC | The Understanding Stage

6th - 8th. Students concentrate on drawing conclusions from the facts they've learned.


RHETORIC | The Expression Stage

9th - 12th. Students work toward persuading others of their interpretations.



TIME-TESTED APPROACH

- **MEMORIZATION** Students regularly recite the songs, poems, quotes, Bible verses, and historical timelines they've been learning.
- CLASSICAL LANGUAGES
 Students learn Latin and Greek.
- GREAT BOOKS Students read the best works from the best authors throughout history.



ROBUST ACADEMICS

- UNIQUE CURRICULUM

 Teacher-created, Christ-centered
 curriculum that emphasizes history
 and the great thinkers of the ages.
- WINSOME COMMUNICATION
 An emphasis on speaking and writing well.
- AHEAD OF THE CURVE
 Our 8th grade graduates enter local public high schools with six credits.

• **HIGH EXPECTATIONS** Students are challenged to achieve great things, as evidenced by their 8th grade *LEAP presentations* and the 12th grade *Senior Thesis*.



NURTURING COMMUNITY

- SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

 Teachers respect all students as unique individuals created in God's image, each with specific abilities and needs, and encourage all to achieve their best.
- **SMALL CLASS SIZES** Individual classes are capped at 16 students, with a *5:1 student-teacher ratio* overall
- ENCOURAGEMENT GROUPS

 Logic School students hear from a
 guest speaker on topics related to


 Christian living, then follow up with
 cross-grade small group discussions.
- READING BUDDIES 4th and 5th graders read to PreK and K students to serve and to build community.

HOLISTIC FOCUS

- **SPIRITUAL GROWTH** A *Christian worldview* is integrated throughout the entire curriculum.
- **PHYSICAL FITNESS** Students learn to care well for their bodies in PE classes and throughout their lives.
- **FINE ARTS** Students gain an understanding of and appreciation for the beauty expressed in *art*, *music* and *drama*.
- STUDENT-LED SERVICE

 6th 12th grade students take time to serve their communities; the Rhetoric Schoolers plan and implement their service project themselves.
- **EDUCATION FOR A LIFETIME**We promote *lifelong learning* and growth of the whole person body, soul, and mind.





AWARDS AND ACHIEVEMENTS


- 10th grader earned a **perfect score** on the NATIONAL GREEK EXAM one of only 25 students *in the world* to do so.
- Last year 50% of Redeemer Logic School students received national recognition on the NATIONAL LATIN EXAM. (Only 38% earn recognition nationally.)
- From PreK 11th grade, Redeemer students will memorize over 600 BIBLE VERSES and over 210 POEMS, SPEECHES, etc.

Expanding our reach

The **proposed additions** to our facilities will enable us to GROW OUR PROGRAMS along with our physical space. An increase in the number of classrooms will mean MORE CAPACITY for additional students and FURTHERING REDEEMER'S IMPACT in our community — making a Redeemer education available to more families.



[1] REROUTE CARPOOL & INCREASE PARKING

This new site plan will increase parking spaces from 17 to 68. In addition, the new traffic pattern will improve safety during pick-up and drop-off for our students and neighbors.

[2] REVAMP & EXPAND THE BREEZEWAY

This +3,000 sq. ft. 2-story expansion will include two additional classrooms, offices, an elevator, and new bathrooms on the second floor. (The existing providing more funds to for bathrooms were completely renovated over the summer.)

[3] BUILD A **BACK ADDITION**

This new addition will create much-needed classroom space by building four (4) additional rooms. This will not only be a cost effective way to expand our physical footprint, but also an unobtrusive one as construction will not limit or impede normal school operations.

As we increase our capacity and enrollment, our ANNUAL BUDGET will expand as well, the regular upkeep of all of our physical facilities.
